

# Twin Cities Community Testing Demographics

These demographics and results are for testing completed on June 9, 10, 16, 17, 23, and 24, 2020 at Jimmy Lee Recreational Center, Sabathani Community Center, Holy Trinity Church, and New Salem Church.

The State of Minnesota, in conjunction with several partners, offered COVID-19 testing to people living in the communities impacted by large gatherings in the Twin Cities area and to community members.

- Testing was open to everyone. Residents of neighboring communities were eligible to be tested. People who lived further away were encouraged to find a local clinic before registering.
- People with and without symptoms were tested.
- Testing was free, no insurance needed.
- Pre-registration was encouraged and could be done online and by phone.
- Testing was administered by professional medical staff.

## Positivity rate: 1.81%

- 13,418 people were tested.
- 243 people were confirmed positive (cases).

## Symptoms

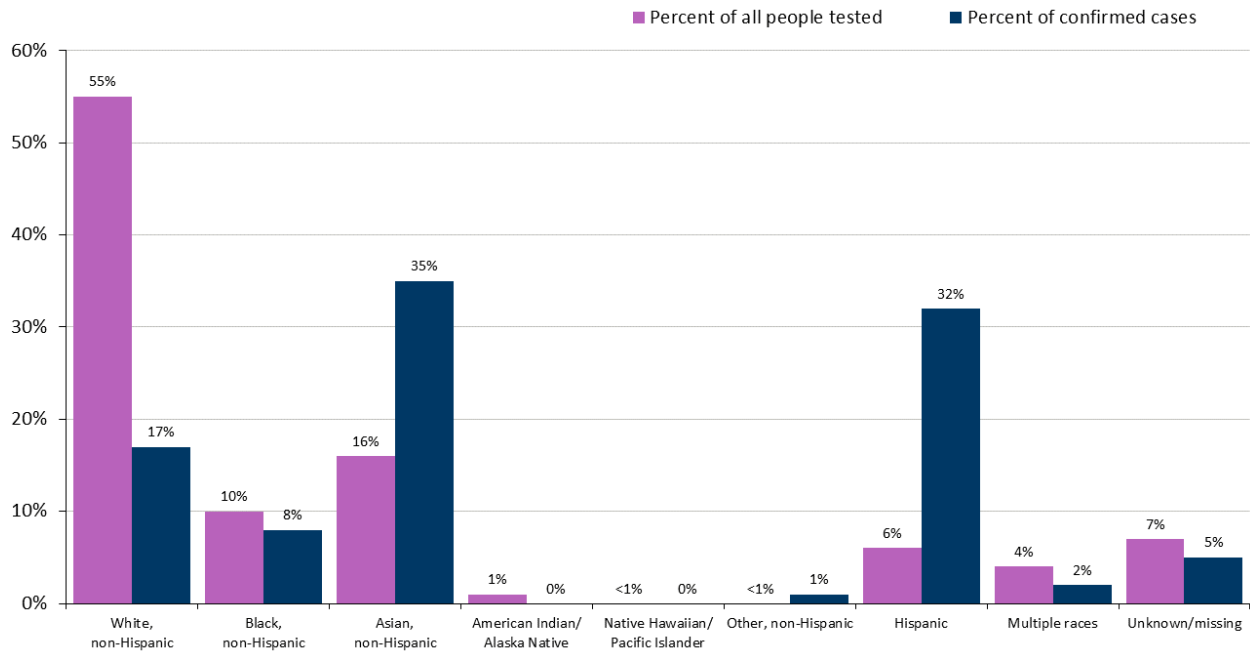

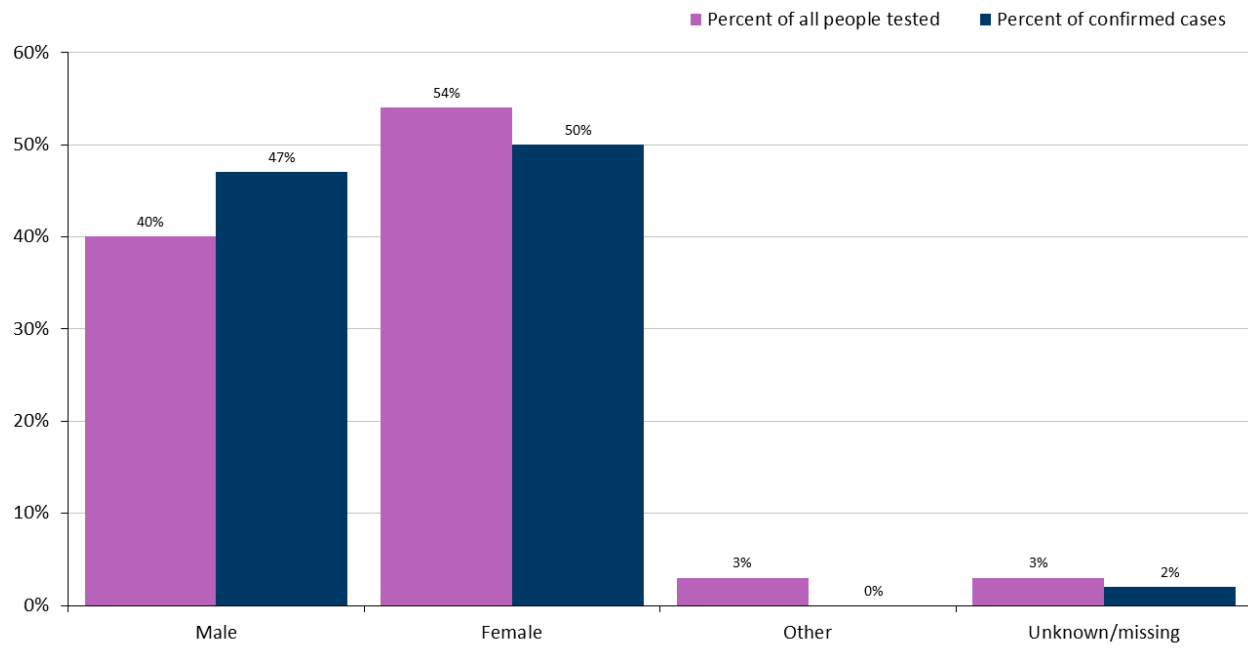

### Positivity rate: 2.27%

- 6,025 people were tested.
- 137 people were confirmed positive (cases).

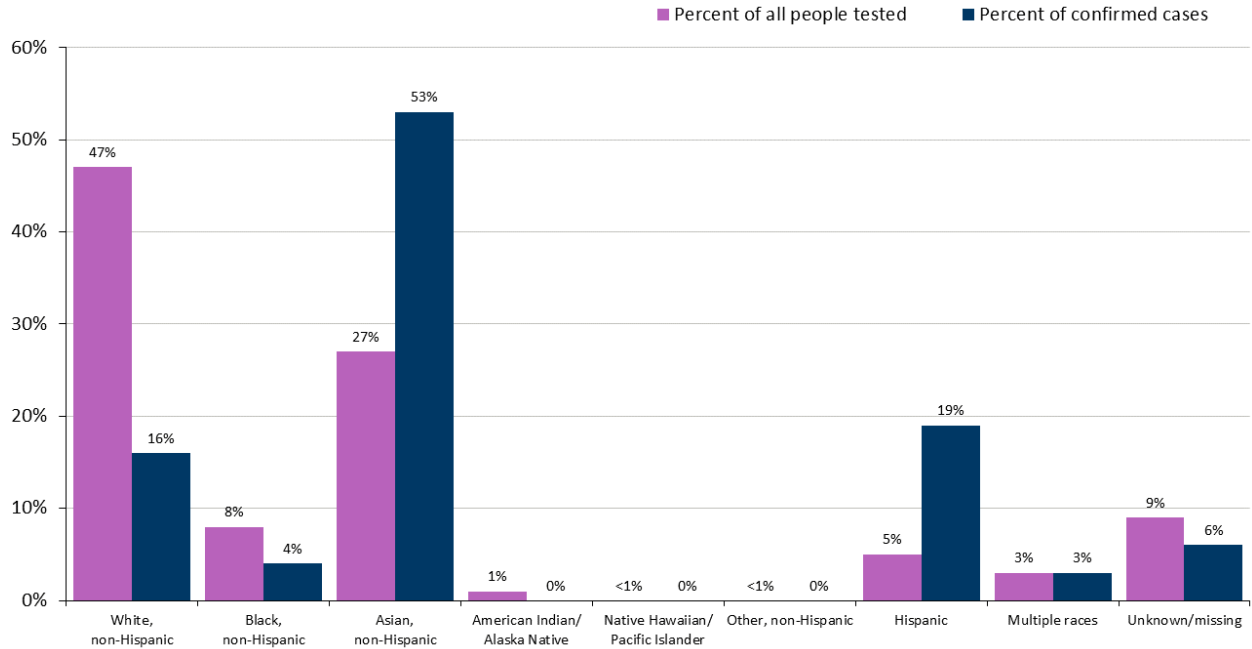

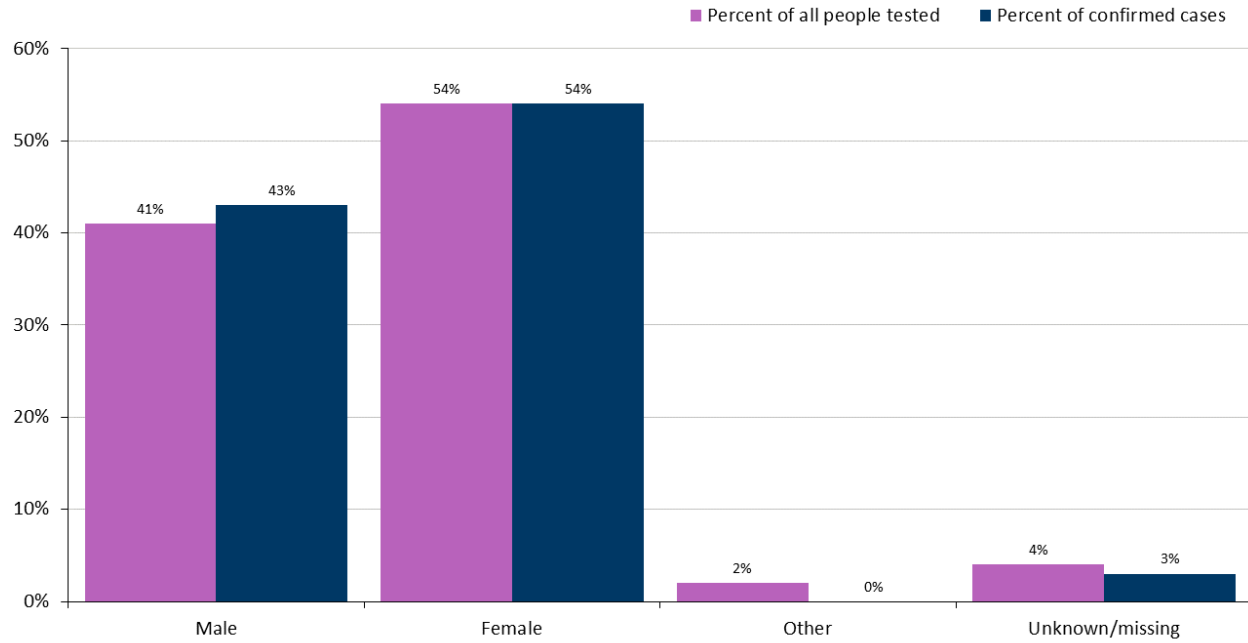

### Positivity rate: 1.17%

- 2,897 people were tested.

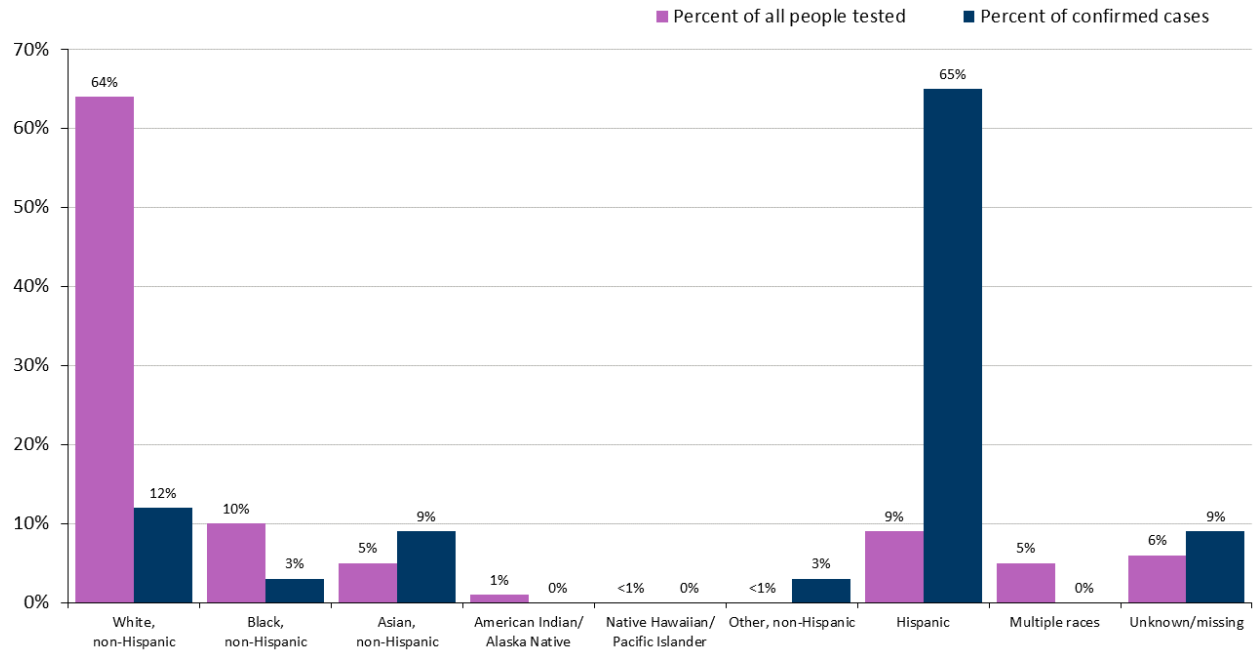

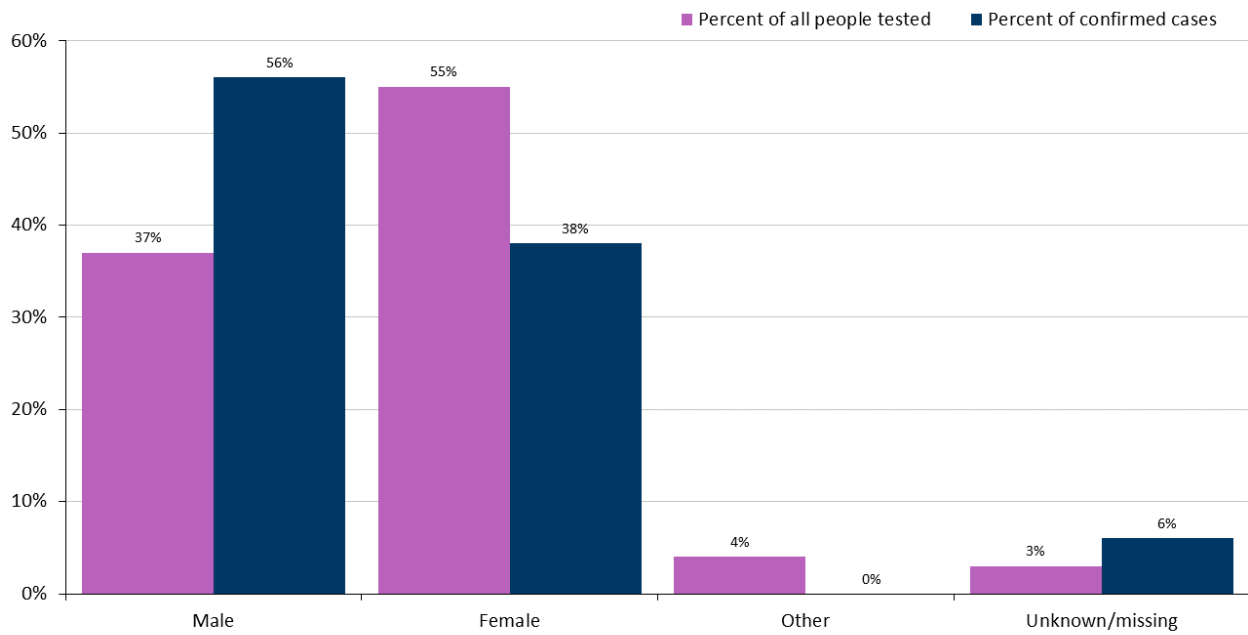

### Positivity rate: 1.34%

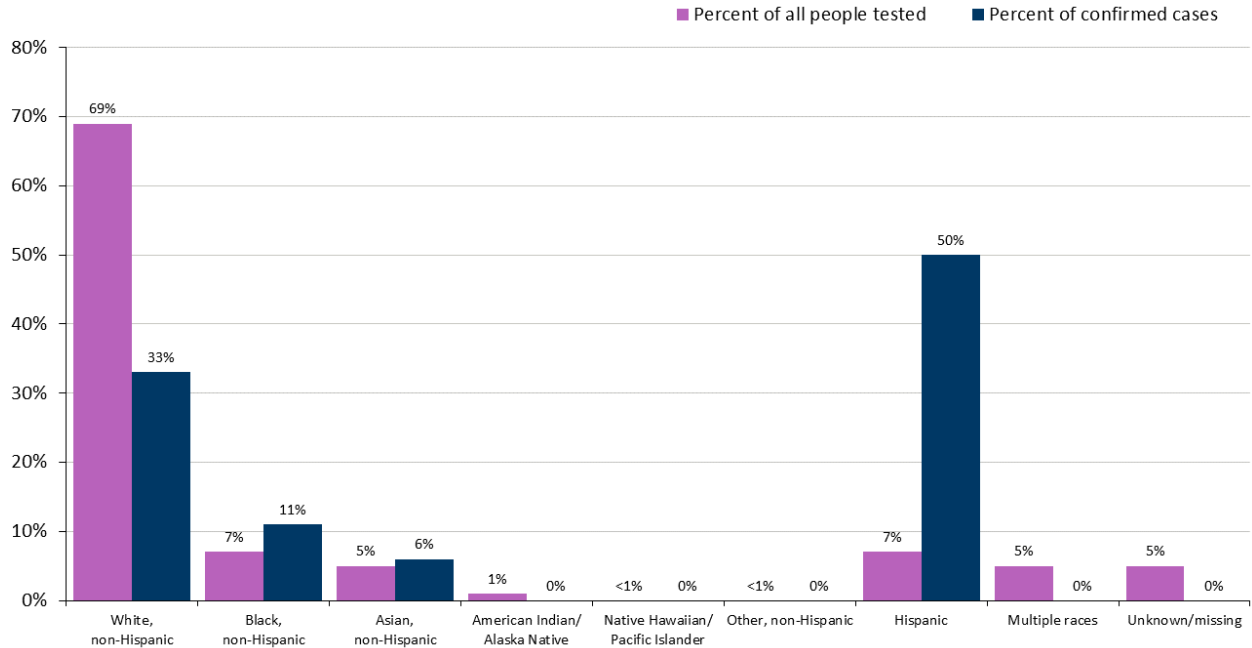

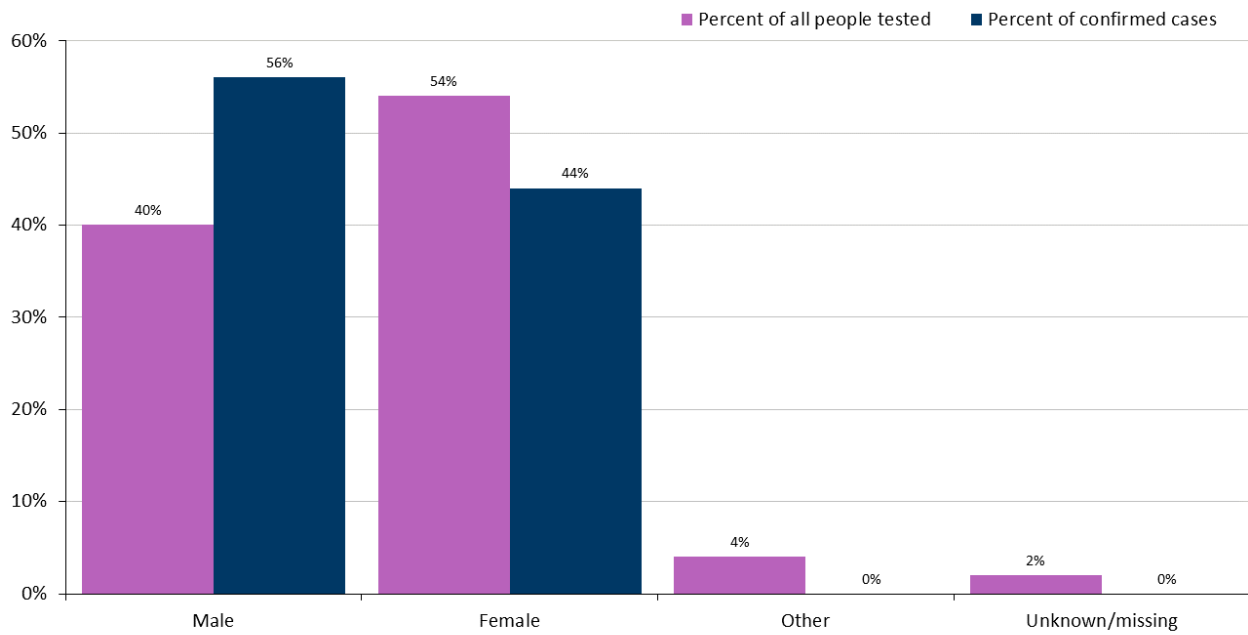

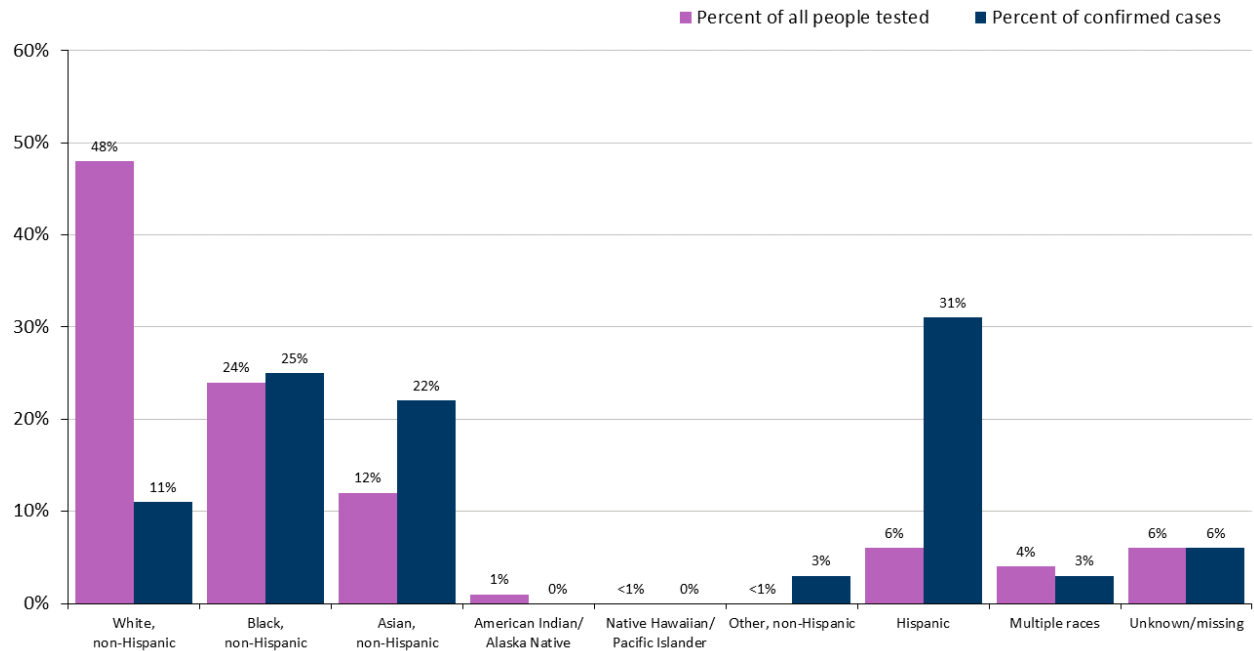

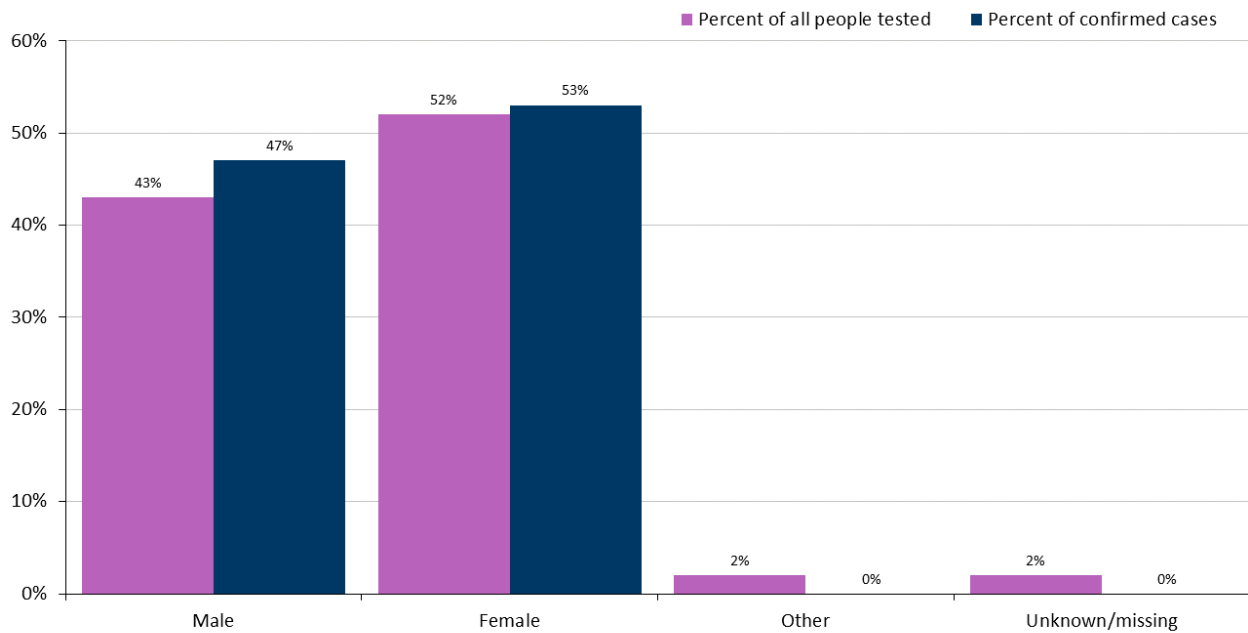
