

Ordering Lentocilin©

Lentocilin© is available to purchase through Cost Plus:

- Go to [Cost Plus Drugs for Businesses \(https://business.costplusdrugs.com/\)](https://business.costplusdrugs.com/)
- Register your organization on Cost Plus Marketplace as a new customer or use an existing account.
 - The register button is near the top-right corner.
- You will be prompted with a series of questions to get set up with the marketplace.
 - The process should take 10-15 minutes.
- Request that the number of Lentocilin© doses are sent to your organization.

What is Lentocilin©?

FDA has approved the importation of Lentocilin©, a Portuguese-manufactured version of penicillin G benzathine.

Why is Lentocilin© recommended?

Lentocilin© should be used to treat cases of syphilis as appropriate when there are barriers to utilizing Bicillin® L-A (penicillin G benzathine injectable suspension), such as during a shortage.

When is Lentocilin© recommended for use?

Lentocilin© is indicated for the treatment of the following infections in adults and children: primary and secondary syphilis, latent syphilis, tertiary syphilis (in adults), and congenital syphilis (in children).

How is Lentocilin© prescribed?
