Definitions

High Risk: The following conditions are considered High Risk. Individual Nutrition Care Plans (INCPs) should be developed for each of these conditions. High Risk Factors are equivalent to the risk criteria unless there are additional criteria in the High Risk Category and Criteria column.

Medical Referrals: If a participant doesn't have health care or if the participant is not being followed by his/her health careprovider for the specific high risk condition identified, a written referral should be made to the health care provider.

Minnesota WIC Information System: The table indicates whether the Information System (Info System) assigns a risk code. It also indicates when the Information System flags a risk code as High Risk.

*If the participant is receiving appropriate ongoing care from a qualified health care provider, then the INCP should consist of adequate documentation that care is being provided elsewhere. If the participant is not receiving appropriate health care, a referral should be made to a health care provider and follow-up of that referral should be provided. Refer to <u>Section 6.6: High Risk Individual Nutrition Care Plans</u> for additional information regarding documentation expectations.
