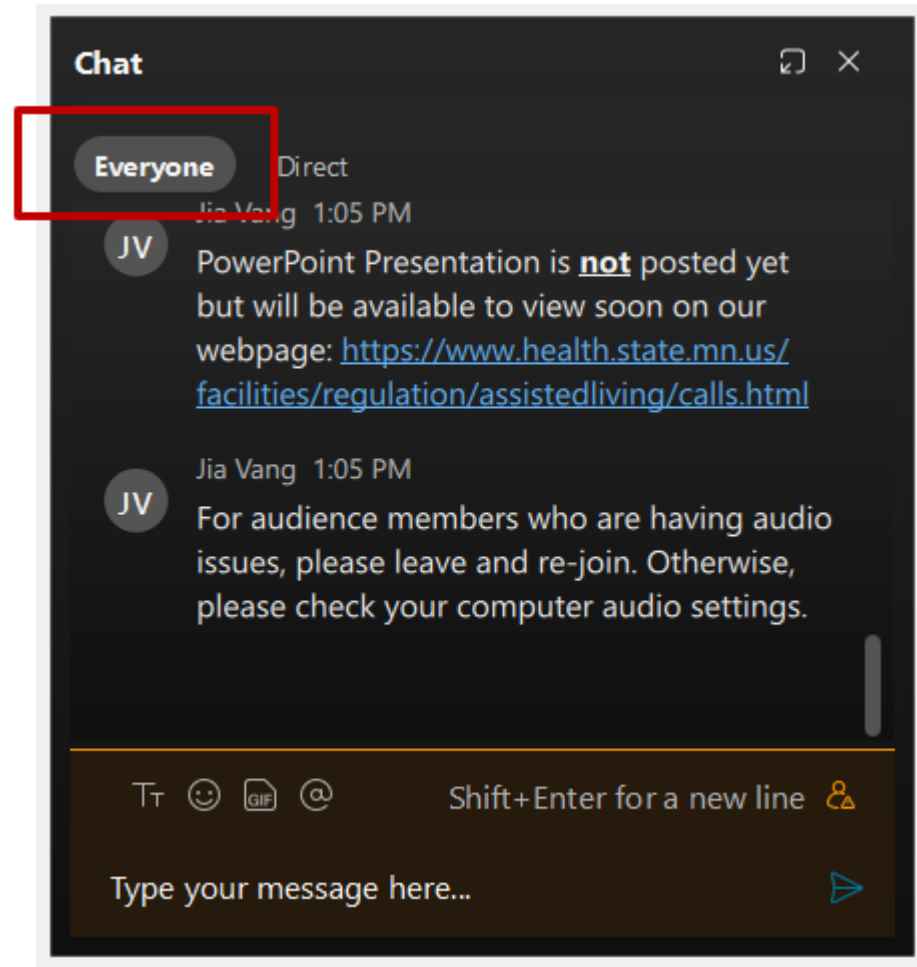

# Grant Program Purpose & Funding

# Grant Program Purpose

- In 2025, the Minnesota Legislature directed that the remaining balance of a special revenue account containing assisted living licensing correction order fine revenues be appropriated to the Commissioner of Health (MDH). These funds are to be used to establish a competitive grant program under Minnesota Statutes, section 144G.31.
- The purpose is to establish an on-going grant program to support special projects or initiatives that improve quality of care and resident outcomes in licensed assisted living facilities. Funded projects or initiatives must advance quality, safety, and positive outcomes for assisted living residents.

# Grant Program Projects or Initiatives

The MN Legislature references Minn. Stat. 144A.4799, Subd. 3(c) for what types of special projects or initiatives may fulfill the grant program purpose.

- Training programs for licensees and their employees.
- Develop and implement information technology and data projects.
- Improve communications strategies to licensees and the public.
- Recruit and retain direct care staff.
- Recommend education related to the care of vulnerable adult.
- Benefits residents, families, and the public in other ways.

# Grant Funding

- As of January 1, 2026, the balance in the special revenue account must be appropriated for grants within two years, provided there are enough grant requests totaling the sum in the account.
- After the first two years, money in the special revenue account must be appropriated annually.
- As of January 1, 2026, the available dollars in the special revenue account for assisted living grant awards is approximately \$3.3 million dollars.
- Up to 10% of the balance of the special revenue account may be utilized by MDH to administer the grant program. MDH expenses will be dependent on the number of applications MDH staff must review, process, and monitor disbursements.

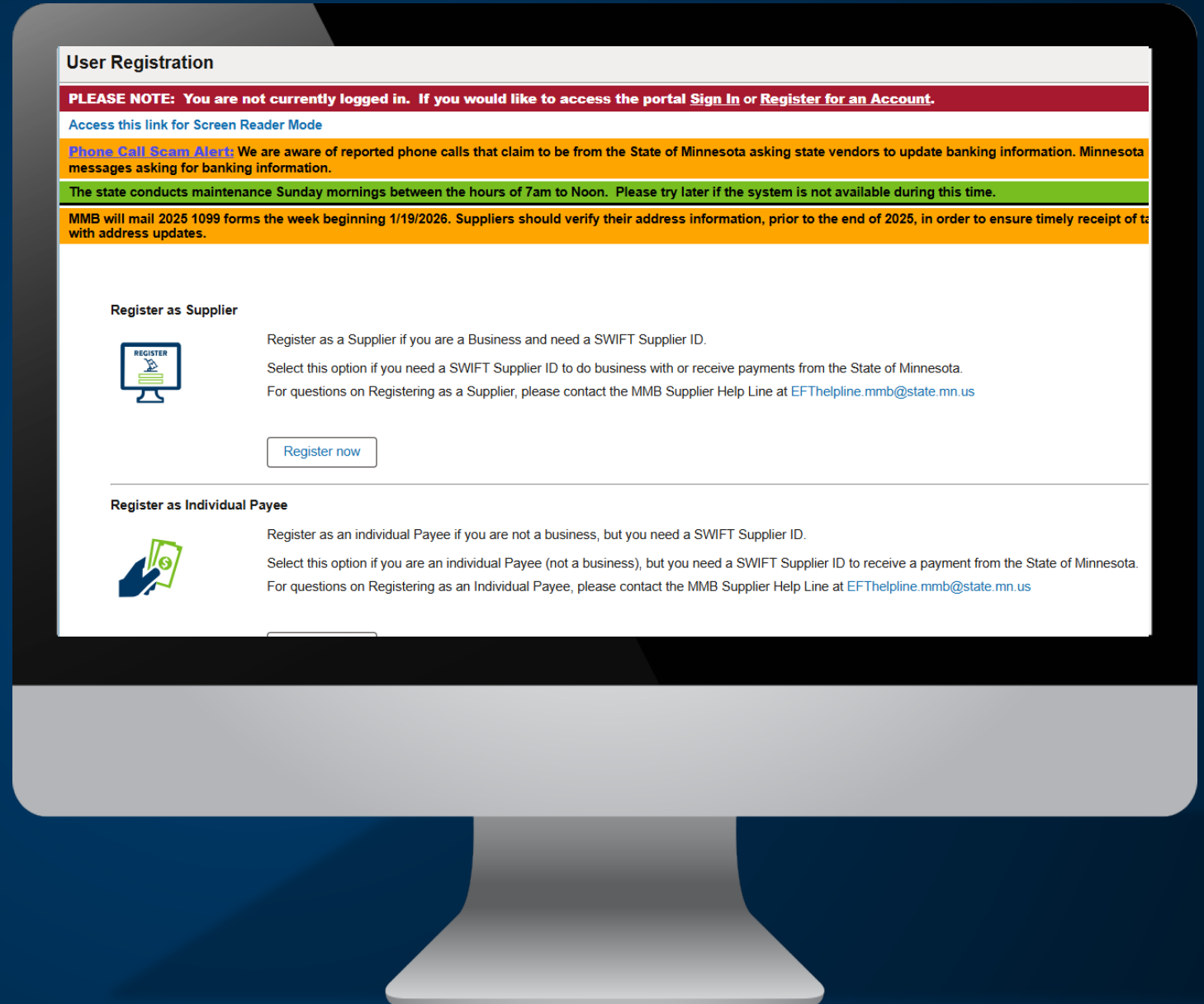
**Applicants who do not have a valid supplier/vendor ID will not move past Phase I of the application review process and will not be under consideration for this grant award.**

Applicants will need to enter this number when they fill out the Assisted Living Competitive Grant Application.

It takes a few days to process the request and receive the vendor ID.

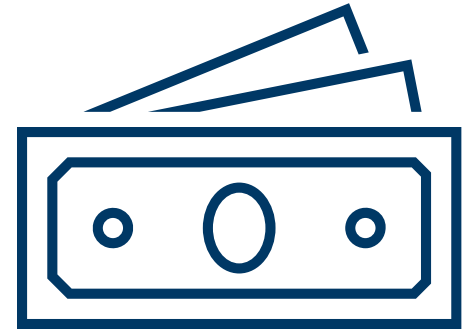
# SWIFT: How to Register

# Minimum Eligible Dollar Amount

- The *minimum* amount of a grant award is \$10,000 per statute.
- There is no cap on a grant award in statute, however, MDH will review the totality of the dollar amount of the total received grant applications to award grants in a fair and equitable way to as many eligible grantees as possible.



# Eligible Reimbursements

To align with Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) contractual requirements:

- Grant funds may only be used for projects or initiatives that begin after the grant is awarded.
- Retroactive funding is not allowed; projects or initiatives that are already completed or currently in progress are not eligible for reimbursement.
- Only MDH approved expenses, incurred after the fully executed grant date, may be charged to the grant.

# Eligible Applicants

- Licensed Assisted Living Facilities or Assisted Living Facilities with Dementia Care under [Minnesota Statutes, chapter 144G](#).
  - ***Provisional licensees are not eligible.***
- Organizations or entities with demonstrated experience or knowledge in assisted living operations, compliance, resident needs, or best practices.



Eligible Uses for Grant Funds

# Allowable Uses of Grant Funds

Based on statutory purpose of the competitive grant program to advance quality, safety, and resident outcomes in assisted living and 144G regulatory requirements, the applicants will select one of six categories on the grant application that best fits their project or initiative:

- Capital Investments (e.g., sprinkler systems, emergency systems, physical plant improvements)
- Education and Training for Staff, Residents, and Family
- Compensation (e.g., for temporary staffing or consultation needs)
- Quality Initiatives
- Information Technology, Data, and Communications,
- New and Replacement Equipment

# Supporting Documentation for Use of Grant Funds

At the time of application, the grant applicant should provide:

- Any supporting documentation that best describes the project or initiative.
- A description of expenses anticipated to be reimbursed that adds up to the total requested dollar amount.
- At least one quote from any business or consultant with whom the applicant may seek third-party assistance for the project or initiative that supports the grant dollar amount requested; at least two quotes preferred for future capital investment projects.

# Project/Initiative Timeline

The project or initiative should be fully implemented and/or completed no later than **12 months** from the date the grant is awarded.

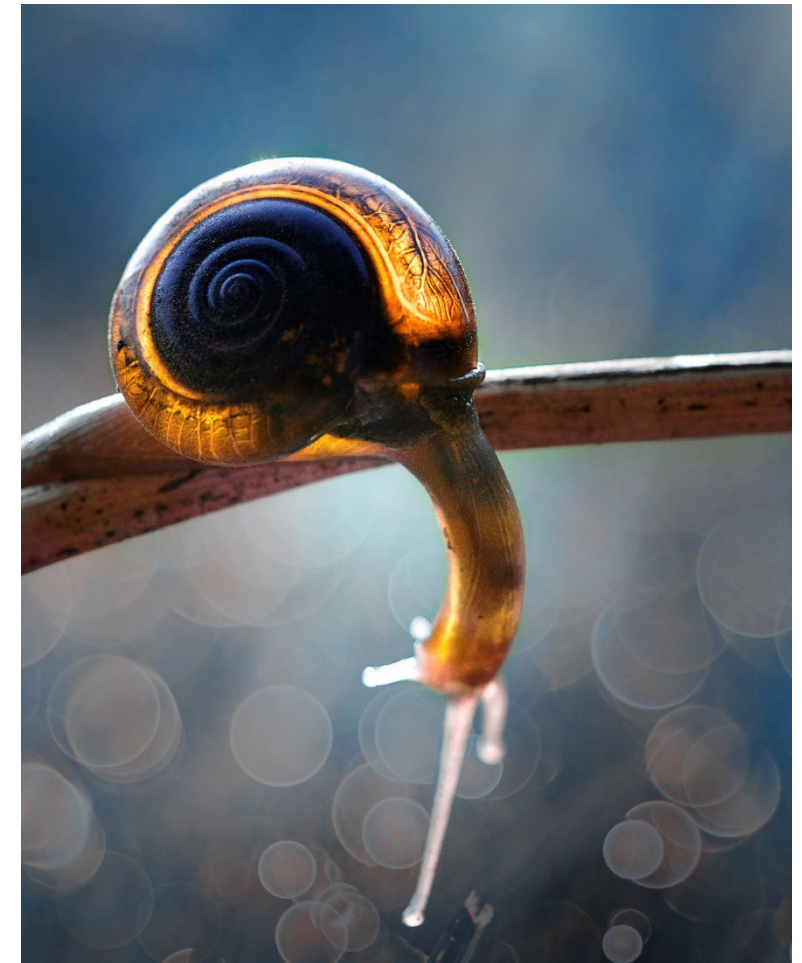




# Application Process

# Don't Rush!

- Grant Awards are **NOT** first come, first served.
- Please take your time, make sure you have everything you need and that your information is correct.
- Prepare all application materials and responses before starting on your on-line application.
- Application Narratives have a 4000-character limit.
- Once you start your on-line application, you can't save and go back – you only get one opportunity to submit your information.



# Who should be completing the application?

Must have legal authority to enter binding agreements on behalf of the applicant.

Application Evaluation & Scoring

- Applications received by the submission deadline will be evaluated by MDH. The evaluation will be conducted in three phases.
- During the evaluation process, all information concerning the grant applications submitted, except for the name of the applicants, will remain non-public and will not be disclosed to anyone whose official duties do not require such knowledge.
- Grant applicants will be notified via email regarding the outcome of their grant application after grant awardees are selected. Grant applicants who did not pass Phase I may be notified by MDH sooner at the discretion of MDH.

# Evaluation Team

- MDH will select an evaluation team to evaluate grant applications.
- MDH and professional staff, other than the evaluation team, may also assist in the evaluation process.
- MDH reserves the right to alter the composition of the evaluation team and their specific responsibilities to effectively and efficiently administer the grant program.
- The evaluation team will review the components of each application submitted.



# Evaluation Review and Scoring

The evaluation team will review grant applications in three phases:

- Phase I: Eligibility/Exclusion Criteria Review (Pass/Fail)
- Phase II: Evaluation of Application Requirements and Project Proposal (500 points)
- Phase III: Selection of the Successful Responders

# Phase I: Required Eligibility/Exclusion Criteria Review (Pass/Fail)

## Applicants must "pass" the following criteria:

- The applicant holds an unencumbered, valid assisted living facility (ALF) or assisted living facility with dementia care license or is an organization or entity with demonstrated experience or knowledge in assisted living operations, compliance, resident needs, or best practices.
- The applicant is **not** a provisional assisted living license.
- The total grant award amount request is \$10,000 or greater.
- The request is not for reimbursement of monies already spent or for debts already incurred by the applicant, i.e. the request is for future expenses only.
- The applicant has a valid SWIFT ID number/account.

If a grant application does not “pass” each eligibility/exclusion criteria, the grant application will not proceed to Phase II for further evaluation and will be considered ineligible to be awarded a grant.

# Phase II: Evaluation of Proposed Project or Initiative

The evaluation team will review the components of each application in Phase II.

Points have been assigned to each of the following grant application component areas:

<b>Application Components</b>	<b>Scoring</b>
Description of the Applicant's Organization	25
Description of Applicant's Proposed Project or Initiative	125
Compliance/Quality/Outcome Focus	150
Budget Narrative	175
Diversity in Grant Making	25
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>500</b>

# Description of the Applicant Organization (25 points)

This section should include information about:

- Description of licensee, organization, or entity's programs, activities, and/or services that benefit assisted living residents and their families.
- The number and description of resident population served, or business clients served.
- Geographic area served.
- Special populations served.

# Description of the Applicant's Project or Initiative (125 points)

MDH is committed to funding projects or initiatives that produce a measurable result for assisted living residents in Minnesota. The proposed project or initiative should have clear objectives that will be used to measure a grantee's progress and demonstrate the project or initiative's effectiveness at ensuring compliance with assisted living statutes and rules. This section should include:

- A clear and detailed project or initiative description regarding the scope of the project or initiative work with easily measurable targets.
- A detailed and specific project timeline, including implementation of all activities described in the project narrative and completion of the target or initiative.

# Description of the Applicant's Project or Initiative (125 points) cont.

- A detailed description that demonstrates a strong alignment between the description and supporting documentation, including alignment with projected expenses for the project or initiative, any submitted expense quotes, and dollar amounts requested.
- A detailed description of how the project or initiative will be carried out in an effective and efficient manner, including who will be involved and what resources are required.
- A description of the target population that would benefit from the project or initiative, a thorough explanation of how the target population would benefit, and how that benefit or impact on the target population will be measured.
- A description of the lasting effects produced by the project or initiative, and how the applicant will continue or support the proposed project or initiative outcomes after the conclusion of the grant.

# Compliance/Quality/Outcome Focus (150 points)

This section should include information about how the project or initiative supports or exceeds current and upcoming regulatory requirements and details how the project or initiative will support or substantially improve the delivery of quality of care, safety, and/or promote positive resident health and/or quality of life outcomes for assisted living residents.

- The project or initiative supports or exceeds compliance standards with applicable assisted living laws, rules, and codes, and does not conflict with or lead to noncompliance with applicable assisted living statutes, rules, or codes, if implemented.
  - Greater consideration will be given to projects or initiatives that significantly exceed the minimum regulatory standards.
  - Greater consideration will be given to projects or initiatives that benefits most or all residents at an assisted living facility or most, if not, all constituents of an organization or entity whose project or initiative focus is assisted living.

# Compliance/Quality/Outcome Focus (150 points) cont.

- The project or initiative substantially improves the quality of care, safety, and/or resident outcomes in a licensed assisted living facility or for assisted living residents across Minnesota.
  - For physical environment projects, greater consideration will be given to projects that substantially improve on-going resident safety for all or most residents at an assisted living facility. Less consideration will be given to projects focused on repairs for normal wear and tear and routine maintenance.
  - Greater consideration will be given to projects or initiatives that benefits most or all residents at an assisted living facility or most, if not, all constituents of an organization or entity whose project or initiative focus is assisted living.

# Budget Narrative (175 points)

MDH cannot pay for projects or initiatives in advance of work, and applicants will need to be able to sustain the service after the grant ends. Grant agreements will be for a 12-month time-period. This section should specify the grant amount requested and detail all expenses for the proposed project or initiative by submitting the following information:

- A Due Diligence Review Form is completed.
- Detailed budget narrative that describes and explains what all estimated costs pay for, including costs for itself and any subcontractors.
- The program budget must be complete, reasonably linked to the proposed project or initiative activities listed in the work plan, and must specify how the amounts for each budget item were determined. The budget is reasonable for the activities and outcomes.

# Budget Narrative (175 points) cont.

- Quotes for project or initiatives are submitted with sufficient detail that specify amounts for each budget item are readily apparent. Quotes submitted from third parties for capital investment projects are Minnesota licensed contractors, subcontractors, and in their appropriate professional field (e.g. electrical, plumbing, construction) with verifiable credentials.
- The budget narrative describes whether the applicant can pay a portion of the expense of the proposed project or initiative if only a portion of the requested dollar amount can be awarded.
- The project or initiative can be sustained after the grant funding is complete.
- The project or initiative will be completed in 12 months if awarded a grant.

# Diversity in Grant Making (25 points)

It is the policy of the State of Minnesota to ensure fairness, precision, equity and consistency in competitive grant awards. Applicants will be reviewed to determine if proposed projects or initiatives serve diverse resident populations and/or the proposed project or initiative has a diversity, equity, and inclusion focus. This section will be scored to determine if the proposed submitted project or initiative meets this special focus area or resident populations:

- The proposed project or initiative supports the following resident populations:
  - Culturally and racially diverse.
  - American Indian/Alaskan Native Elders.
  - Older adults in rural areas.
  - Veterans; or
  - LGBTQI older adults.
- The proposed project or initiative describes the services provided and outreach methods that will be used to effectively reach or support these resident populations.

# Phase III: Selection of the Successful Applications

- Only applications found to be responsive under Phases I and II will be considered in Phase III. The evaluation team will review the scoring in making its recommendations of the successful applicants. MDH will review the final scoring, total dollar amounts requested, and number of submissions by any one licensee, owner, or business entity to ensure equity and fairness amongst applicants in the distribution of awards.
- MDH may submit a list of detailed comments, questions, and concerns to one or more applicants after the initial Phase II evaluation. MDH will only use written responses for evaluation purposes. The total scores from Phase II for those applicants selected to submit additional information may be revised because of the new information.
- In the event contract negotiations are unsuccessful with the selected grant awardees, the evaluation team may proceed with the next highest scored applicant.
- After MDH and chosen applicants have successfully negotiated a contract, MDH will notify the unsuccessful applicants in writing via email that a grant will not be awarded to the applicant. All public information within grant applications will then be available for applicants to review, upon request.
